The VA will remove patient care related equipment and furniture. The construction contractor is responsible for other items that remain such as plumbing fixtures that may need to be protected in place or removed and reinstalled after the construction work for the project is completed. The VA does not have a storeroom for items the construction contractor may have to remove to perform their work. These items shall be stored by the construction contractor and be reinstalled by the construction contractor. The VA does not believe there is equipment or furniture that the contractor may need to remove that needs to be in a climate-controlled environment.



Ref drawing 1-AS-04 – During pre-bid we were unable to view ICU rooms 3C-53 and 3C-54. Note 1 indicates ceiling to be completely removed but does not call out lift removal. Based on drawing 1-AS-10 keynote 12 indicates to reinstall patient lifts. Is the contractor required to remove lifts? What manufacture are the patient lifts?

The construction contractor shall be responsible to hire ARJO or ARJO certified staff for the removal, reinstallation, testing (after reinstallation) and other work required work to recertify the patient lift system is safe for patient use. This applies to each of the ICU patient rooms where work is performed under this contract. The portion of the ARJO patient lift system that is below the ceiling shall be removed. The supporting structure above the ceiling can and should remain unless the contractor determines it has to be removed and reinstalled after the HVAC work is complete.

All existing ICU patient rooms currently have ARJO lifts installed.

The viewport in the ACAD drawing MH-10 cut off notes 3 and 4. Notes 3 and 4 read as follows:

- 3. BALANCE EXISTING GRILLE/DIFFUSER TO AIR FLOW RATE INDICATED.
- 4. 18X14 EA DUCT UP TO ATTIC.

In addition, hex note 1 should state "PROVIDE AND INSTALL A NEW VISUAL DIGITAL ROOM DIFFERENTIAL PRESSURE MONITOR FOR THIS ROOM". STAFF SHOULD BE ABLE TO READ FROM OUTSIDE THE ROOM IN THE CORRIDOR.





Will work in the occupied spaces (patient care, nurse areas, etc.) have to be done before and/or after hours? Will normal working hours be acceptable if coordinated well in

advance? Will EMS be assisting with any cleaning?

Work in occupied spaces shall be coordinated through the VA COR with a minimum of 21 calendar days' notice. Depending upon what the planned work is going to be, will in part determine if the work will be done before or after normal work hours. Work that is disruptive to patient care may have to be scheduled before or after normal hours, but in areas like 3-Main where patients are in the nursing unit 24 hour a day, work may be during normal business hours so as not to disrupt the patients when they are asleep for the night. Work that is not disruptive to patient care, such as wall finish installation in a well-ventilated construction enclosure could take place during normal business hours.

The contractor shall do their pick-up, general cleaning, etc. and the contractor, VA COR and EMS will work to schedule EMS staff for the final cleaning and disinfection of the areas before the next business day.
